Community Connect Grant Program Department of Agriculture Utilities Programs

The Community Connect Grant Program provides financial assistance to eligible applicants that will provide service at or above the Broadband Grant Speed to all premises in economically-challenged communities where broadband service does not exist. The deployment of "community-oriented broadband services on а connectivity" basis stimulates economic development and provides enhanced educational and health opportunities in rural areas. RUS will give priority to rural areas that demonstrate the greatest need for broadband services, based on the criteria contained herein.
