Funding Opportunities

The Texas Workforce Commission (TWC), is accepting applications for Disaster Unemployment Assistance (DUA) as a result of the February winter storm. Under Presidential Disaster Declaration ([FEMA 4586-DR](#)) dated February 19, 2021, workers who lost their jobs and self-employed individuals who have been unable to work due to damage sustained from February winter storm may be eligible for Disaster Unemployment Assistance benefits. - Earthquake
- Tornado or hurricane

- Chemical spill, leak, or seepage
- Other disasters
