USDA Pandemic Response and Safety Grant Program

The USDA created the Pandemic Response and Safety Grant Program to address the needs of specialty crop producers and processors, distributors, and various other wholesalers and producers, who had been insufficiently supported during the COVID-19 pandemic to address costs incurred due to the virus. Eligible small businesses may apply to be reimbursed for costs including workplace safety measures, market picots, retrofitting facilities, transportation, worker housing, and medical, including paid sick leave, between Jan.27th, 2020, and Dec.31st, 2021. Applications opened Oct.6th, 2021, and close 10:59 PM CDT on Nov.22nd, 2021. Click Here! To apply

Texas Enterprise Zone Program

The Texas Enterprise Zone Program (EZP) is a state sales and use tax refund program designed to encourage private investment and job creation in economically distressed areas of the state. Texas communities must nominate companies in their jurisdiction to receive an Enterprise Zone designation and thus be eligible to receive state sales and use tax refunds on qualified expenditures by submitting an application on the company's behalf. Companies must meet minimum capital investment thresholds and create and/or retain jobs that employ a certain percentage of economically disadvantaged individuals, enterprise zone residents, or veterans.
