Funding Opportunities

FY 2023 TxCDBG Downtown Revitalization and Main Street Program Grant

The FY 2023 TxCDBG Downtown Revitalization and Main Street Programs have opened for applications! These Programs' objective is to provide infrastructure improvements to address the conditions that contribute to the deterioration in an area designated as slum or blighted in the applicant community's downtown or main street area. Eligible applicants are cities with less than 50,000 people, and counties with less than 200,000 people, with a designated downtown district satisfying two or more of the following:

- The city's historic area of commerce
- May be the area around the courthouse or city square;
- Commercial area for the community
- Buildings of historical significance, but not primarily residential
- Must be areas included in or contiguous to the economic center of the community; and
- The retail area for the community that does not include single-family dwellings.

Applicants designated as a Texas Historical Commission Main Street City must apply for the Main Street Program portion on the grant. Awards are \$250-500,000 with a minimum 3.5% cash match. Deadline to apply is May.3, 2023.
