Did You Know?

FEMA Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) Program

This Program makes federal funds available to states and local communities for pre-disaster mitigation activities. FEMA will provide financial assistance for the following activities:

- Capability and Capacity-Building activities, which enhance the knowledge, skills, expertise, etc., of the current workforce to expand or improve the administration of mitigation assistance.
- Hazard Mitigation Projects (construction)— cost-effective projects designed to increase resilience and public safety; reduce injuries and loss of life; and reduce damage and destruction to property, critical services, facilities, and infrastructure
- Management Costs – financial assistance to reimburse the recipient and subrecipient for eligible and reasonable indirect costs, direct administrative costs, and other administrative expenses up to 15 percent of the total amount of the grant award
